# SYSTEM REVIEWS

## Polaris

The vendor demonstrations mostly featured Polaris Leap.

### <u>Pros</u>

- Options for streamlined ordering and receiving
- Can search ISBN-10/13 in Acquisitions
- Can navigate between Acquisitions and Bib records and vice versa
- Many options for reports
- Granular permissions
- From within a PO record, can click on a Fund and see that it's encumbered
- Can partially receive from a PO and from an Invoice
- ASN option available
- Can bulk add existing Bib info into a PO
- Can search full catalog from Acquisitions

### <u>Cons</u>

- Uncertainty over the effect of record locks
- Can only move funds at the beginning of fiscal year
- No average discount
- Uncertain whether a PO line can be un-cancelled

## SirsiDynix

The vendor demonstrations featured SirsiDynix SymphonyWeb.

### <u>Pros</u>

- No record locks
- Audit trail when changing or moving funds
- Average discount
- Customizable layout with holding codes/shortcuts
- Tolerant of network interruptions
- Options for streamlined ordering and receiving
- Can navigate between Acquisitions and Bib records and vice versa
- Can search ISBN-10/13 in Acquisitions
- Can search full catalog from Acquisitions
- Many options for reports

- Granular permissions
- Common tasks dashboards can be customized- including font & size

### <u>Cons</u>

Unsure about functionality for moving funds within hierarchy Status information hard to find No real fund hierarchy, each fund is standalone but can define up to 6 levels within each

## **Bibliovation**

We did not have vendor demonstrations or visits for Getlt Acquisitions. Assessments are based on our current experience of the software.

### <u>Pros</u>

- No record locks
- Purchase orders and Invoices are color-coded by status
- Already familiar with Bibliovation

### <u>Cons</u>

- No average discount
- Cannot easily designate ordering of multiple copies of the same title
- Standing orders functionality not usable
- Enriched EDI only tested with one vendor, adding additional vendors requires more extensive testing and setup
- No options for streamlined ordering and receiving
- Cannot do ISBN-10/13 searching in GetIt
- Cannot do automatic UPC searching from PO
- Cannot navigate from Bib record to GetIt
- Cannot search full catalog from Getit
- Neither library staff nor SCLS staff can easily create custom reports in GetIt
- Permissions options for GetIt are not very granular
- No options to purge or archive old data
- Minimal audit trail

## RECOMMENDATION

Overall, the group consensus is that either Polaris or SirsiDynix would work for Acquisitions. The group would like to move away from Getlt Acquisitions/Bibliovation.
